

"Today we gather to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of His Passion and Resurrection."

Message from Our Deacon . . .

I invite you to enter into this Mystery more deeply than you ever have before. I would suggest that beginning with this Commemoration of Christ's entrance into Jerusalem that you will live the events that will unfold this week as though they were happening for the first time, right here, right now.

If you haven't already planned on attending and celebrating this Holy Week in its entirety, it's not too late to change your plans, adjust your schedule and live within the solemnity of the events that we will be celebrating this week.

As you enter into Jerusalem with Jesus today, plan on staying for the entire week, experience Jesus with Lazarus and Mary and the betrayal of Jesus by Judas that take place in the early part of the week. As we begin the Easter Triduum on Holy Thursday, enter into the Upper Room and attend the first Mass, be present when Christ institutes the Eucharist and the priesthood that remain with us until the end of time. Keep vigil with Jesus after His arrest on Thursday night in order to enter more deeply into the depth of His love for you. Live Good Friday, the day of Fast and Abstinence with the disciples in Jerusalem. Be present at the trial, walk with Jesus as He carries the cross in atonement for

your sins and mine. Be present when He gives us His mother and gives up His Spirit. Stay with our Blessed Mother Mary through the dark night after the death of her Son and spend the day with her

on Saturday in hopes that you may be of some assistance and consolation to her as she spends the day without the presence of her Divine Son. Enter into the Holy Night of the Passover of Christ from death to life at the Easter Vigil.

May the fruit of this Lenten Season and Holy Week be more bountiful for each of us than they have ever been before...+

The answer is C. Red symbolizes the shedding of blood & I is therefore used on Palm Sunday (when Christ entered Jerusalem to prepare for His death), Good Friday, any other commemoration of the Lord's Passion. Red also signifies the burning fire of God's love. For this reason, red vestments are worn on Pentecost & during Confirmation.

Good Friday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence.

Fasting: Everyone, from the celebration of their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they

should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

> Abstinence: All persons who have already celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and ALL Fridays of Lent.



Divine Mercy Devotion Ministry ~ DIARY OF ST. FAUSTINA ~

The Diary of St. Faustina is the second most important book in the world, after the Bible. It is a record of the inspiring life of St. Faustina, as she experienced the profound supernatural events that shaped her entire life. It reveals the supremely holy and wise personality of the author,

not so much in what she said about herself, but in her honest reaction to the ordinary and divine moments of her everyday life. But the true purpose of the Diary was to document the instructions of Jesus as to how He desired the new devotion to His Divine Mercy to be formed. It is this point that makes it the second most important book in the world, because it contains the actual words of Jesus spoken to St. Faustina regarding His Mercy and the new devotion to His Divine Mercy, which He willed to be established in His Church.

here have been many saints such as Padre Pio, St. Leopold Mandic, St. John Vianney and many others who have had the extraordinary gifts of the Holy Spirit like reading souls and making prophecies, and to whom Jesus appeared and guided them. The only other saint who had an experience similar to St. Faustina was St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, to whom Jesus spoke to her and gave her instructions about a new devotion to His love which became known as the Sacred Heart Devotion. But even in the Sacred Heart Devotion, Jesus did not instruct her to directly write down His words and instructions. In fact, He requested that a priest, Fr. Jean Croiset, be the person to write the book, which would become the main text for the Sacred Heart Devotion. It was only St. Faustina to whom Jesus gave explicit instructions to write His words regarding the new devotion He wished to establish in the world. This is a further reason why the Diary of St. Faustina is so special. It is because is is absolutely unique in the history of the Catholic Church.
