

"I have risen, and I am with you still, Alleluia." ~ Entrance Antiphon Ps 139 [138]: 18, 5 - 6



Message from Our Pastor . . .



"This is the day the LOTA has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

e repeat the above acclamation in response to each verse of Psalm 118 which we have after the first reading. I believe that the Lord has made this day for a purpose. This day is a day to rejoice and be glad to celebrate the joy of Easter. We learn from the sacred scriptures that after Jesus died and in the tomb for three days, He rose again from the dead. His followers found the huge stone which was used to close the tomb rolled away and His body was inside. Peter and John ran to the tomb after Mary Magdalene came and told them. They found no one in the tomb except the





burial cloths and linens. John, who was the disciple Jesus loved said that he went in the tomb, saw the cloths and believed.

Peter in the first reading gave his testimony to Cornelius, a centurion of the Cohort called the Italica, and the people who were at the centurion's house. The bible tells us that he was sent by God to witness the resurrection to Cornelius (a Gentile) and his household. Peter said to them, "We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that He be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. He

commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead." I believe Peter had remembered all that he saw at the tomb on the day of resurrection which today's Gospel tells us. He witnessed that Jesus has really risen from the dead.

In the second reading we heard St. Paul urging the people of Colossae to act according to who they are as people who were raised with Christ. He said to them, "If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory."

e are people of the New Testament and we have shared the same faith as the people of Colossae. We also need to seek what is in heaven and think about what we will have in heaven with God because Jesus is coming again to take us to where He is in glory. Let us live as people who believe in the resurrection and fix our eyes on heaven. Keep doing what we need to do to get to heaven and avoid doing what may prevent us from going to heaven.

The LOTA made this Easter Season for us to rejoice and be glad in it.

Just as the Image can serve as a reminder of the ocean of Divine Mercy, as well as its price, so can the daily remembrance of the Divine Mercy at the hour of Christ's death. Jesus asked Saint Faustina, and through her us, to celebrate this Hour of Great Mercy, promising tremendous graces to those who would, both for themselves and on behalf of others.

t three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy. In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion. (Diary 1320)



s often as you hear the clock strike the third hour immerse yourself completely in My mercy, adoring and glorifying it, invoke it's omnipotence for the whole world, and particularly for poor sinners, for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul. In this hour you can obtain everything for yourself and for others for the asking; it was the hour of grace for the whole world - mercy triumphed over justice.

ry your best to make the Stations of the Cross in this hour, provided that your duties permit it; and if you are not able to make the Stations of the Cross, then at least step into the chapel for a moment and adore, in the Most Blessed Sacrament. My Heart, which is full of mercy: and should you be unable to step into chapel. immerse yourself in prayer there where you happen to be, if only for a very brief instant. (Diary 1572)

You died, Jesus, but the source of life flowed out for souls and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fountain of Life, immeasurable Divine Mercy, cover the whole world and empty yourself out upon us. O Blood and Water which flowed out from the heart of Jesus as a Fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You! Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and the whole world.
